#### INTRODUCTION

Founded in 1904, the Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA) has a mandate to govern the practice of motor sport worldwide by the authorities of 149 nations. Through the International Karting Commission (CIK-FIA), it awards the only official titles of FIA Karting World and European Champion at the end of the most prestigious Competitions, which are organised in collaboration with its Services Provider RGMMC Group and the National Sporting Authorities (ASNs) involved.

n addition to motor sport, the FIA is also concerned with automobile mobility and tourism, with safety as a priority.

The purpose of this dossier is to present the Karting discipline as well as the various FIA Karting Championships, Cups and Trophies for the 2025 season.







#### KARTING

Invented in the United States in the 1950s, karting quickly became a great success in Europe and today is a fully-fledged motorsport discipline.

Rarting is a great school of life for young people and the best way to learn about driving and racing. The best route for the future car champions, karting is also practiced by enthusiasts who devote all their energy to it. The FIA Karting Championships are open to drivers from the age of 12, with no upper age limit.

Although the kart is basically a machine of simple design, the high standard of competition makes it a very high level sport where ultra-competent professional teams confront each other.



#### A WORD FROM THE CIK PRESIDENT

Akbar Ebrahim, CIK-FIA President: New Global Karting Plan is our commitment to nurture talent and grow our sport

K arting is essential to the development of motorsport. To ensure its future, the CIK-FIA under the leadership of the FIA President Mohammed Ben Sulayem, has launched a new Global Karting Plan to consolidate the category's foundations. The aim is to eliminate economic barriers and increase participation worldwide with the focus on affordability, accessibility and diversity.

We are committed to broadening karting's base and welcoming new talent by encouraging growth and recognition at the national, regional and continental level by creating a Karting Centre of Excellence in each continent and offering competitions using the 'Arrive & Drive – Single Spec' format to complement the existing progression pathway.

For the first time, there will also be a prize fund for a talented driver from the senior category to move into F4 and from the junior category to participate in the senior karting category. With a gradual implementation phase over the next three years, the first milestones will be reached as early as 2025.

These initiatives will complement our FIA Karting Championships, which remain a prime showcase for high-level competitive karting. The number of participants in our Championships, Cups and Trophies broke records again in 2024 and we are determined to continue in this direction in 2025.

We are surrounded by service providers, organizers, manufacturers and teams who continue to do an excellent job while striving to improve the image of karting. The situation looks favorable for the coming season.

Building on its success since 2010 for drivers aged 12 to 14, a second FIA Academy Trophy is now open to Senior drivers aged 14 to 16. The OK-N World Cup will be joined by an OK-NJ World Cup for Junior drivers.

The 2025 FIA Karting season will see the return of Germany to the international calendar with a European Championship event on the Mülsen circuit for the first time. The same will be true for the Italian circuit of Viterbo in the OK and OK-Junior European Championships.

The Danish circuit of Rodby will be back on the schedule after its successful introduction in 2023. The partnership with Mondokart.com has been renewed this year to the general satisfaction of all concerned.

Since its introduction at the beginning of 2023, the IKR (International Karting Ranking) has proved its relevance in assessing the progress of drivers around the world in a large number of categories. Since 2024, it is supported by a national version, the NKR (National Karting Ranking), which will gain in exposure in 2025 with the granting of the President's medals to the top contenders of national championships and series that will be registered into the system by National Sporting Authorities (ASNs).

I look forward to a safe and successful 2025 season as we embark on laying the solid foundations of a brighter future for our sport.



#### RGMMC, SERVICE PROVIDER OF THE FIA KARTING CHAMPIONSHIPS

The RGMMC Group is the Service Provider of the FIA Karting European and World Championships. Based in Switzerland, RGMMC Group is renowned for the great experience in the field of its owner Roland Geidel, President James Geidel and the team that has been around for many years.

ncreasing the audience for Karting Competitions, attracting new partners and working closely with ASNs (National Sporting Authorities) are the priorities of RGMMC Group. The Services Provider also develops the communication and media coverage of the competitions by providing live video viewing during the competitions and by partnering with Motorsport.tv for broadcast around the world. The various FIA Karting Championships accounts on social networks (X, Instagram, Facebook, Youtube) inform and attract many enthusiasts throughout the year.





# OK-N: BACK TO THE ROOTS

In 2023, the FIA Karting has launched a new concept derived from the premier class, the OK, in order to develop its base.

#### Accessibility, reliability and performance

OK-N allow National Championships to use a universal category, adapted to all of the Competitors of each National Sporting Authority to strengthen competition from the bottom up.

#### **Technical specifications**

From 15 years of age, CIK-FIA approved chassis, rear brake only, hydraulic control.

Engine 125 cc 2-stroke with balance shaft, water cooled, max. engine speed 15000 rpm, power +/- 35 hp, monotype exhaust, 30mm bowl carburettor or 24mm diaphragm carburettor.

No gear change, no clutch, no starter, no battery.

Decompression valve for easy starting with a pusher.

Minimum weight: 155 kg with driver on board

A simple and economical solution has been chosen to develop a Junior version of the OK-N for drivers from 12 to 14. A 26 mm flange on the exhaust differentiates the OKN-Junior from its elder OK-N. The engine itself is strictly identical, as well as the carburettor and the exhaust system. The minimum weight, driver on board, is 145 kg.




#### A COHERENT SPORTING ENVIRONMENT TO GUARANTEE ACCESSIBILITY

The unique technical framework that governs OK-N had to be accompanied by a harmonised sporting vision between all the Federations, with the FIA Karting World Cups - OK-N and OK-NJ in sight from 2025.

To this end, the FIA Karting recommends that the ASNs put in place a simplified sporting scheme, in line with the accessibility values of the OK-N.

Six engine manufacturers offer OK-N engines: IAME, LKE, Modena Engines, Rexon Motors, TM Racing and Vortex.



#### INTERNATIONAL KARTING RANKING (IKR), A DIGITAL RESULTS MONITORING SYSTEM

The IKR is a digital ranking system open to all drivers holding a licence issued by a National Sporting Authority recognised by the FIA and participating in a competition karting event. The results of the IKR produce an overall ranking of the drivers, as well as sub-rankings based on a model similar to the ATP tennis ranking. Its purpose is to promote the standardisation of kart racing throughout the world.

This ranking gives an overview of a driver's performance regardless of the category in which they compete, as long as they use CIK-FIA homologated or approved equipment. It is an additional opportunity to reward drivers through an overall ranking and to award them special mentions or an honorary title of "driver of the year" for example. Multiple possibilities of classification according to different criteria (age group, nationality, type of Competition, etc.) are enabled by the system set up, which become more interesting over time.


The points are calculated automatically from a logarithmic rule. The ranking takes into account the type of event through different grades, the position of the driver or the team (endurance) in the final ranking of the Competition, as well as the number of Competitors entered in the category. Two weighting coefficients are used in the calculation according to the equipment used and the format of the event.

The IKR is updated weekly every Wednesday at 18:00 CET and can be reach: IKR

The NKR (National Karting Ranking) is also managed by the CIK-FIA for national classes.

The trophy for IKR Driver of the Year 2024 was awarded to Belgian Dries Van Langendonck, who achieved the highest score in a field of over 1,300 competitors.

## THE FIA KARTING SPORTING SEASON

The CIK-FIA and its Services Provider organise three FIA Karting World Championships every year, true highlights of the season each decided during a single Competition, in addition to the FIA Karting World Cup - KZ2 re-launched in 2022. In addition to the OK-N World Cup, an OK-NJ World Cup will be created in 2025.

With the introduction of the new KZ2 Masters category in 2024, five FIA European Karting Championships are also on the programme for several competitions.

The FIA Karting Academy Trophy has, over the past 15 years, brought together the best prospects between the ages of 12 and 14 from around 50 countries to compete on a one-make basis. From 2025, it will be available in Junior (12-14 years) and Senior (14-16 years) versions.

The Karting Competitions offer extensive track time to the Drivers during many runs lasting between 10 and 20 minutes.



In addition to its powerful gearbox motor, the KZ category is characterised by greater freedom in the chassis allowing development of the equipment. This is the domain of factory teams and professional Drivers including the greatest specialists of karting.
